-Fr found out today we are in copy right violation by live streaming our music etc. The diocese has a way to join One License to give us access to the music, etc. It will cost Holy Rosary \$360 and St. Stephen's \$180/year.

Old Business

-Time and Talent info is entered. Amber will get the information to the parish office.

-School Loan: balance is \$316, 700. Towards the end of the year we collected \$88, 448. Finance committee meeting was pushed to next week. Fr Greg will propose partial payment to leave \$20, 000 in checking. Fr. has not checked with others who need to fulfill their pledge.

-Parish Directory: approved final proofs and waiting for publication.

-New finance committee members are Lori Quinn and Scott Hays to join Jeff Albus, Rick Brandt, and Gina Carroll.

-D of I disbanded. Altar Societies for both parishes are taking over the funeral dinners. The money was divided to societies, KC Hall, and others. The families pay for the meat and/or donate to D of I. Everything else is brought in by members. Would like to make the total cost of a funeral dinner a ministry to the grieving family of the parish in the future.

-Church Renovation: nothing further to report.

Pastor Report

-Finances: there's an anonymous donor who has given in the past based on students in school. This past year we received \$35, 600. At the end of every year, the Spalding Trust pays parish \$23, 708 for maintenance and grounds. The Hamilton fund donated \$8, 000 to the church and \$6, 000 to the school? Tri-County's donation of \$20,000 to Church and school was discussed last meeting. There was a family who wanted to support the school in paying art and music teachers, so a Fine Arts Fund was established and received \$35, 000.

-In late December Fr. Greg purchased a new phone system for parish office and rectory for \$1, 500. It's a web-based system. Fr. Greg and Deacon Mike can now receive voicemail on their cell phones. This is now a \$100/month charge when phone bill used to be \$160-180/month.

-We do have Wi-Fi in the Hall. We are using a bridging system from the school. Passwords are different. We need to get a new projector for the KC Hall and may also need update on sound system. Many thanks to David Hays for organizing and setting up.


