Dear Parishioners,

We welcome Bishop McKnight to Holy Rosary Church this Saturday evening as he comes to worship with our parishes and celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation with our seventh, eighth and ninth grade youth.

As you know, the Sacrament of Confirmation is one of the initiation Sacraments in our Catholic Faith. Confirmation is often misunderstood. In receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation, it is *Jesus Christ who confirms our faith* rather than "us choosing to be Catholic." This Sacrament helps to mature us into Adult Catholics, as it is the last of the three Sacraments of Initiation these youth receive.

In the Sacrament of Confirmation, the baptized person is "sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit" and is strengthened for service to the Body of Christ. The prophets of the Old Testament foretold that God's Spirit would rest upon the Messiah to sustain His mission. Their prophecy was fulfilled when Jesus the Messiah was conceived by the Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. The Holy Spirit descended on Jesus on the occasion of His baptism by John. Jesus' entire mission occurred in communion with the Spirit. Before He died, Jesus promised that the Spirit would be given to the Apostles and to the entire Church. After His death, Jesus was raised by the Father in the power of the Spirit.

The Holy Spirit in Confirmation deepens our baptismal life that calls us to be active witnesses of Jesus Christ in our families, neighborhoods, society, and in the world. We receive the message of faith in a deeper and more intensive manner with great emphasis given to the person of Jesus Christ, who asked the Father to give the Holy Spirit to the Church for building up the community in loving service.

Congratulations to our 47 youth who are now new, fully initiated members of the parishes of St. Mary Parish in Shelbina, St. Stephen Parish in Indian Creek (Swinkey), and Holy Rosary Parish in Monroe City. We look forward to all that the Holy Spirit will do through each of them in Catholic Ministry and Christian service in our community. May the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation in our parishes enkindle the fire of the Holy Spirit in each of us throughout this Easter Season. We have begun celebrating these sacraments of Grace. Continue to pray for our second graders who will receive First Holy Communion on May 2nd. May we all receive anew the special graces of Easter Communion. – Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love.
