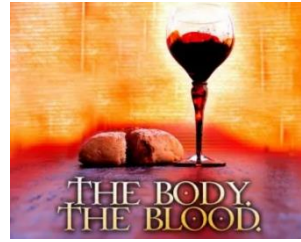

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

Dear Parishioners,

*"O Sacrament Most Holy,
O Sacrament Divine,
All Praise and All Thanksgiving,
Be every moment Thine."*

At Mass today, as we begin the Communion Rite, we hear the priest say, "Behold the Lamb of God" ...the assembly responds, "Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof...". It seems like an odd response but it comes from Matthew's Gospel (8:8) when the Roman Centurion says to Jesus, "Lord I am not worthy to have you under my roof." Jesus was going to go to the soldier's home to cure the man's son and the centurion did not want Jesus to travel all that way so he says, "Just give an order and my boy will get better." We are not worthy to receive Jesus in the Eucharist and yet he gives himself completely to us in the Body and Blood of Christ. Receiving this Holy Communion compels us then to bring Christ into our World by being a part of every aspect of our life.



The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ — Corpus Christi — is always an important day in the Church, but it has special significance this year. The feast, celebrated on June 19, 2022, in the United States,

marks the beginning of a multi-year initiative by the U.S. bishops to renew the Church by inviting the faithful into a living relationship with Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.

The National Eucharistic Revival, as the initiative is called, will include diocesan and parish-based formation and, following a National Eucharistic Congress to be held July 2024 in Indianapolis, will culminate in a "Year of Going Out on Mission." Our parishes and diocese will be involved in this renewal through catechesis and evangelization. To be a faithful and good disciple, we must have the Eucharist at the center of all we do.

Happy Father's Day! Today, let us surely remember to pray for all who are dads. The pressures of our world can make being a parent very difficult today, and yet study after study shows how important it is for a child to have a strong, supportive, loving, male role model in his or her formative years. Dads are pulled in many directions by society today; let us pray that they have the fortitude to put God, faith, and family first in their lives.

Not all who are fathers can be with their children on Father's Day. We pray for our dads and grandfathers who have died, may they be with God and continue to teach their children how they may attain the rewards of heaven. Some fathers have to be away from home and children due to work or military service; we pray that they may know the love of God and family through our prayers.

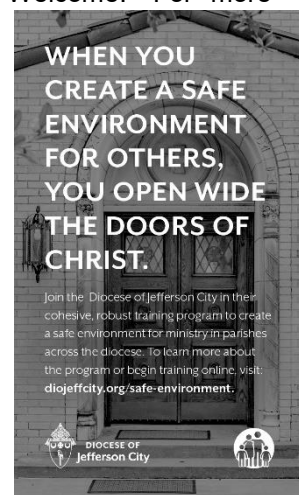
School News
