Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioners,

The Good Samaritan (Luke: 10:29ff), in this Sunday's gospel, models for us the Theological Virtue of Charity. Pope emeritus Benedict XVI in his first Encyclical, *Deus Caritas Est*, [God is Love] instructs those responsible for teaching charity:

Paragraph 33. *Deus Caritas Est*

With regard to the personnel who carry out the Church's charitable activity on the practical level, the essential has already been said: they must not be inspired by ideologies aimed at improving the world, but should rather be guided by faith which works through love (cf. Gal 5:6). Consequently, more than anything they must be persons moved by Christ's love, persons whose hearts Christ has conquered with his love, awakening within them a love of neighbor. . . . The consciousness that, in Christ, God has given himself for us, even unto death, must inspire us to live no longer for ourselves but for him, and, with him, for others. Whoever loves Christ, loves the Church, and desires the Church to be increasingly the image and instrument of love which flows from Christ.

As good stewards, as faithful disciples, we are all called to obey the greatest commandment:

*You shall love the Lord, your God,
with all your heart,
with all your being,
with all your strength,
and with all your mind,
and your neighbor as yourself."*

AND to be responsible for modeling and thus teaching Charity. Virtues makes us one in Christ. In our pastoral and diocesan plan for ministry, we are embracing being a parish of charity and mercy. We strive to be compassionate and merciful like the Good Samaritan.

In living out the parable, we are compelled to conclude that being a neighbor is not simply a matter of doing good but of identifying with the last, lost, least, little, and lifeless. It is easy in our daily routine to notice only vices and forget the virtues given by God to every person. Whether we like our neighbor or not, we are called to love them and let Christ mend their wounds through us.

This week, let's do our best to follow Jesus' instruction to the Jewish lawyer who asked, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus tells the parable and the lawyer answers his own question after Jesus poses it to him and the lawyer responds, "The one who treated him with mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."
