Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioners,

Hospitality is the theme of our scripture readings today. Abraham goes out of his way to personally serve his three guests. In Luke's gospel, Jesus uses a tense situation between Martha and Mary to teach about making room for the Word of God in the busy-ness of life.

Jesus calls us to open ourselves to God and be attentive to the Word of God. Let us try to learn the lesson Jesus taught Martha. Martha was "anxious and worried about many things." Jesus reminds her that Mary "has chosen the better part" because she is listening to Jesus and welcomes Jesus in hospitality by her listening. Martha is "doing hospitality" which is okay if she remembers why and for whom she labors so that she can listen even in her busy-ness.

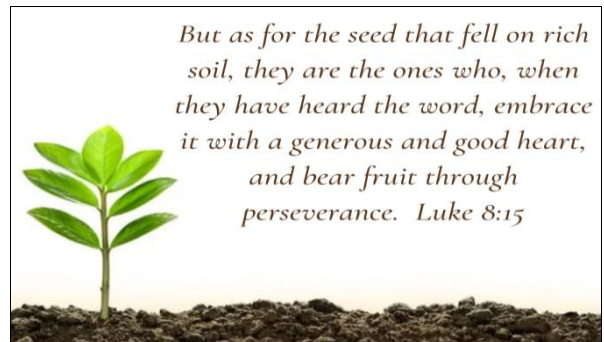
Let us look for ways to show hospitality this week. Remember to open your heart and busy schedule to the Lord and, like Abraham, go out of your way to **make God a welcome guest in your home**. To show hospitality to one another, we not only need to welcome the stranger, but let us remember to look across the room to the people we are with every day. Let's remember that we do all for the greater glory of God and maybe that will help us listen in our busy-ness and be less anxious and worried about everyday things.

Readings for July 24, 2022

1st Reading – Genesis 18:20-32 The Lord was outraged at the sinfulness of Sodom and Gomorrah and was determined to destroy them, but Abraham interceded on behalf of the innocent who lived in those towns, and the Lord relented.

Responsorial Psalm – Psalm 138:1-2, 2-3, 6-7, 7-8 Lord, on the day I called for help, you answered me.

2nd Reading – Colossians 2:12-14 The author of Colossians wrote, "You were buried with him in baptism, ...also raised with him. "God has forgiven all our transgressions and "removed it from our midst, nailing it to the cross."

Gospel – Luke 11:1-13 Jesus taught his disciples the "Abba" prayer. He encouraged them to pray with persistence and to keep knocking on the door. "For everyone who asks, received; and the one who seeks, finds."

- First day of school will be held on August 18th with dismissal at 12:30.

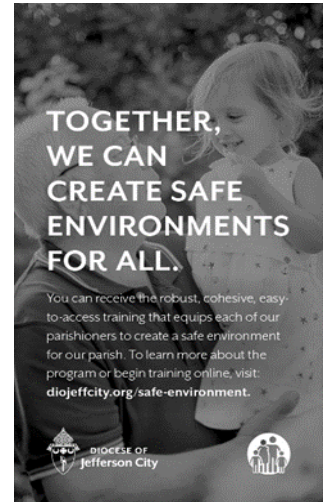
Following God's Lead along with Donna
